The Peacebuilding Peacelearning Intensive (PPI) is a one-week learning program designed to capacitate participant's abilities to envision, plan and strategize for just, safe, healthy and sustainable communities.

PEACEBUILDING

Participants will be coached in the design and development of a strategic peace-building plan with ongoing guidance for project development after the PPI.

The National Peace Academy takes a proactive and holistic view to addressing domestic challenges through applying theories and successful approaches of peacebuilding developed around the world, thus providing a unique and practical opportunity to bring peacebuilding into our local communities and culture.

PEACELEARNING

Participants will explore transformations in thinking and behavior necessary to bring about positively focused change through attending to issues of community health, poverty, violence and sustainability.

Peacelearning is a process emphasizing life-long learning toward the full development of the peacebuilder. It is directed toward both inward and outward growth, encouraging shared responsibility for being the change and creating transformation in our communities.
